What? Title I SES Providers Fair—All 72 have been invited!! When? Wednesday, August 31, 2011


Time? From 3:00—6:00 PM Come at your convenience!!!

Here are some tips to help you get your child excited about reading.

Reading Corner

- Invite your child to read with you every day.
- Visit the public library with your child to select books to read together.
- When reading a book where the print is large, point word by word as you read. This
 will help your child learn that reading goes from left to right and understand that the
 word said is the word seen.
- Read your child's favorite book over and over.
- Read many stories with rhyming words and repeated lines. Invite your child to join in on these parts. Point, word by word, as your child reads along with you.
- Discuss new words. For example, "This big house is called a palace. Who do you think lives in a palace?"
- Stop and ask about the pictures and about what is happening in the story.
- Ask your child to retell the story to you when you have finished reading the book.
- Read from a variety of children's books, including fairy tales, song books, poems, and information books.

Character Trait for September: Responsibility

What is **Responsibility**?

- * Knowing the right thing to do and doing it. If you are not sure what to do the responsible thing to do is ASK a teacher or parent.
- * It means that others can depend on you. you keep your promises, agreements and commitments. This means you are accountable.
- * Doing your best.
- * Focusing on YOUR part, not on someone else's. This is personal responsibility.
- * Admit your mistakes, don't blame oth-

ers or make excuses.

- * Accepting credit when you do the right thing and accepting correction when you make a poor choice.
- * Being on time.
- * Taking on new responsibilities when you're ready!

Adults at Wayman are expected to role model responsibility. Please help us by modeling this at home.

Principal's Birthday Party



Planning for a Parent/Teacher Conference



It is important that you spend some time talking with your child's teacher about his/her progress at school. Write a note to your child's teacher and request a time for a conference. You can prepare for the conference by making a list of questions or concerns that you may have. Involve your child in the conference. Make a three way plan and hold each other accountable for roles discussed. You may also request that a member of the Leadership Team be available for the conference. Please know that we are here to work with you as a team.

Tips for a Successful Conference

- Ask your child if there is anything that he would like you to discuss with the teacher.
- Jot down everything that you want to talk about at the conference.
- Arrive promptly or a few minutes early.
- Begin with positive comments about the teacher or classroom.
- Avoid lengthy discussions of topics that are not related to the purpose of the conference.
- Be open-minded to suggestions from the teacher.
- ♦ Keep your emotions under control.
- Take notes about what has been discussed.

Change in the Way Your Child Gets Home
