

We encourage the students to bring their notebooks home daily to review what has been covered in class as a way to prepare for the tests. The scrimmage test measures what they have mastered of the standards that have been taught in class the previous two weeks. Please continue to check your child's agenda daily for any messages and their conduct grades. With warmer weather on the way, it is important for students to remember to come to school in uniform.
