

When reading with your child at home, please make sure they are using those strategies and retelling the story to you to enhance their comprehension. In Math, we have been working on greater than/ less than/equal and balancing equations. Please continue reviewing all math that comes home to ensure their understanding. In Writing, we have been focusing on writing a complete story about a single topic. We have written make-believe and expository stories, where we have been able to explain things about our own lives. 4th Grade

Happy New Year!

Welcome back students, we hope everyone had a great holiday break. Now it's time to get back to work because

FCAT is approaching fast. This month we will pick up where we left off with finding equivalent fractions and writing fractions in simplest form. We will also discuss decimals, and percent of fourths, tenths, and hundredths, and their connections to our everyday life. Always remember to study your multiplication and division facts daily!

In Reading, author's purpose, cause and effect, homographs, suffixes, and base words with affixes. Please, keep reading your chapter books. Visiting your local library is an enjoyable and educational experience for the whole family.

In Writing, we have begun our unit on Expository Writing. We learned that when the prompt asks us to explain something we need to write an expository essay instead of a narrative story. Writing a five paragraph essay encompasses an initial paragraph which should engage the reader, three paragraphs with three general reasons, and a concluding paragraph. The concluding paragraph must recap the reasons and details given in the essay. I look forward to reading your next expository essays.

5th Grade

Fifth grade has been working hard to master the standards. We have covered adding and subtracting decimals and are currently working on adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers with unlike denominators. We will be moving into measurement after this current topic. In science, we have begun our unit on the Solar System. The next unit of study will be weather. Please make sure your child is reading 20 minutes a night and ask them monitoring questions to check comprehension. At this time we are in desperate need of glue sticks and tissues. Any donations would be much appreciated. Please remember to send your child in uniform every day and with needed classroom supplies. Don't forget that the second quarter ends January 16, 2014.

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
