

Kindergarten

We have learned so much this school year already and we know our students will show great progress as the year continues. In ELA we have been learning about retelling (Beginning, Middle, End,). We also have learned many new words that will help our students become star readers and writers. We will continue learning our letters and letter sounds and writing our first and last name. In Math we have been studying the numbers 1-5 and learning how to compare them using the words greater, less than, and equal. In Science and Social Studies we have learned about our five senses and how scientists use them to study the world around us. We have also learned about the life cycle of an apple and pumpkin. We are discussing what autumn is and what we will see during this season. Continue logging your child on at home www.thinkcentral.com:) Please let your teacher know if you need any help.

1st Grade

First grade is learning all about how to model subtraction with pictures, bar models, and number sentences. We have also been using our Go Math! interactive lessons to practice our addition skills.

In Language Arts, we are learning how to blend letter sounds and have even begun timed reading in order to increase our fluency.

2nd Grade

In Math, students are learning Number Concepts. Students work with equal groups of objects to gain foundations for multiplication. Students are also learning about Place Values. They are able to read and write numbers to 1,000 using base-ten numerals, number names and expanded forms. Students will compare two three-digit num-

bers based on hundreds, tens and ones digits using greater than, less than and equal to.

In ELA, students are reading the story "Henry and Mudge" and identifying Nouns, Common Nouns, verbs and adjectives. Students also are identifying the Subject and Predicate of a Sentence. In Writing, students are learning Narrative Writing. They are able to identify Sequence of Events of a story.

Questioning strategy: Who, what, when, where, why and how to be used before, during and after reading. Students practice making predictions and inference when reading.

In Social Studies, students are learning about Map Elements (legends, compass rose, scale, title), text features in (headline, sidebar, bold words), answering

the 5W and 1 H questions about Nonfiction texts (Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How). What it means to be a have good citizenship and

manners. In Science students are learning about Science Tools (hand lens, thermometer, ruler, measuring tape, scale,) and the Scientific Method.

3rd Grade

We are off to an energized year of learning! Our students are growing in all areas.

As mathematicians our students continue learning several strategies and properties for adding and subtracting within 1.000.

In reading we are working on reading comprehension. Please have students continue to read each evening and complete responses which are due each Friday.

As writers students are learning the editing process. They will write reports using an introduction, body,

and conclusion.

Social Studies students learn about local & state government as well as all the U.S. states.

As scientists students learn the methods of scientific investigation. Please continue to check and sign student plans daily as is primary form of communication.

4th Grade

In math, students are calculating distances between different places around the world.

In science, students are studying about marine biologist and oceanographers and what they do. They also are learning about the different geographical areas that they visit and research.

In Writing, students are learning how to construct an opinion piece. In Reading they are learning how to determine a theme of a story by making inferences from gathered details.

5th Grade

5th grade learning is SPOOK-tacular! In Social Studies we are exploring the geography of some of the most fascinating places, and our kids are amazed at all the world has to offer. Next, in Language Arts we are focusing on Story Structure, Theme, and Comparing/Contrasting a variety of texts and topics. In addition to reading, we are preparing opinion writing pieces on a variety of scientific topics. Parents/Guardians please ensure your child is getting plenty of Keyboarding/Typing practice at home or at the library in preparation for the FSA in Writing.

Our 5th grade students will continue to be well-rounded as they learn about *Division of Whole Numbers* and *Adding/Subtracting Decimals* in mathematics. Future scientists in the making! In science class our children are learning about *The Practice of Science* and *The Characteristics of Scientific Knowledge*. Please note: Each student has assigned homework nightly, and please remember to check agendas daily.
